Re: State of Alaska revenues attributable to out-of-state visitors

Out-of-state visitors to Alaska resulted in an estimated \$182 million in State of Alaska revenues in 2024, as outlined in the following table. All figures reflect calendar year 2024. The largest sources of revenue were Alaska Railroad Corporation, Commercial Passenger Vessel excise tax, and non-resident Fish & Game license/tag fees.
